

## **CRIMINAL JUSTICE MANAGEMENT AND ETHICS - CJME**

### **CJME 1000 Understanding the Old Testament 3 hrs**

Developing beliefs and practice of Hebrew religion as set forth in the Old Testament. Meaning of its faith for the modern world.

### **CJME 1001 Introduction to the New Testament 3 hrs**

Exploration of the New Testament as a living document that has shaped Christian life in the past and continues to do so today.

### **CJME 1002 Introduction to Criminal Justice System 3hrs**

History, role, development, and philosophy of the criminal justice system in democratic society, introduction to agencies and their functions in the administration of criminal justice, and career orientation.

### **CJME 1003 Introduction to Law Enforcement 3hrs**

This course will explore the historical development of law enforcement agencies, focusing on the British and American systems. Students will be exposed to pre-hiring criteria, examinations, physical and psychological testing, background investigations, mandatory police training, field training programs, and in-service training will be detailed, as well as the role of the police ethics, and values.

### **CJME 1004 Criminal Law 3hrs**

Students will study the characteristics of particular crimes, the general principles of liability to punishment, and the negation of punishability by reason of special defense.

### **CJME 1005 Criminal Evidence and Procedure 3hrs**

Criminal evidence and procedure and their application in trials. Rules of evidence, rules of procedure, arrests, searches and seizures, use and suppression of evidence in trial, constitutional implications.

### **CJME 1006 Criminology 3hrs**

This course is designed to explore crime and the criminal, social, cultural, biological, and psychological theories of crime causation and control and treatment of criminal.

### **CJME 1007 Juvenile Delinquency 3hrs**

Etiology and extent of delinquency, personal, familial, community factors; theories, punishment and treatment, preventive and institutional agencies and research.

### **CJME 2000 Corrections 3hrs**

This course is designed to explore topic of corrections. It will include the developmental history of the field, the issues facing the decision-makers, the social reactions to the control and treatment of offenders, the various components that make up the corrections system, and how social change has impacted the field.

### **CJME 2001 Techniques of Interviewing 3hrs**

This course will discuss how facts are gathered and analyzed; it will begin with the initial interview and cover such topics as taking statements from victims and witness.

### **CJME 2002 Victimology 3hrs**

This course will examine the relationship between the criminal and his or her victim, the victim's role in the criminal justice system, and the rights and needs of the victim and the criminal impact on the victim.

### **CJME 2003 Christian Ethics in Modern Life 3hrs**

The meaning of Christian faith for the moral life with reference to contemporary moral issues.

### **CJME The Study of Religion 3hrs**

Definitions and functions of religion, methodologies by which it is studied, relationship to other areas of human culture.

**CJME Christian Ethics 3hrs**

The basis of Christian social responsibility, in terms of theological and sociological dynamics. Emphasis on developing a constructive perspective for critical reflection upon moral action.

**CJME Research Methods in Religion 3hrs**

An introduction to the study of the main disciplines within the scientific study of Christianity including methods and research skills.

**CJME Religion, Politics and Society 3hrs**

Exploration of the diverse approaches and perspectives that American religious groups embrace with respect to some of the more controversial and diverse elements of contemporary American life.
